General characteristics

Mount Burr Primary School is a small country school located in the timber town of Mount Burr in the Limestone Coast of South Australia. Employment is restricted to the surrounding districts, i.e. Timber mill, Kimberley Clark (paper manufacturer), local businesses in Millicent or the surrounding farms. Family situations cover a wide range of the economic and social spectrum.

Student management

All school staff are familiar with the student well being and inclusion policy of the School. Staff and students are familiar with the Randall Clinch "Attitude by Choice" program, Positive behaviour for learning and Playberry Laser. The school discipline policy encourages logical consequences and restorative justice in line with Berry St philosophies.

School leaders as well as a leadership group are elected at the beginning of each year and student voice is actively encouraged.

Curriculum

Subject offerings

Mount Burr Primary School endeavours to offer a balanced curriculum in the eight areas of study. Our current staff, offer strong bases in Maths, English, Physical Education & Health, Science, The Technologies and The Arts.

Special curriculum features

Mount Burr Primary is a lead school in STEM. Japanese is taught across the school in conjunction with our feeder Millicent High School. Shared sessions occur between the Preschool and R/1 class, facilitating a smooth transition between Preschool and School. Mt Burr values community connections and engages in Expeditionary Learning which link to community and industry. Students have the opportunity to be involved in environmental programs through the Young Environmental Leaders Program, Walking the Seasons and March in May.

Mt Burr has a particular focus on The Arts with the program being offered with a specialist teacher.

Teaching methodology

Mount Burr Primary School is an open space construction with multi year levels in all classes. Teachers use a variety of teaching strategies from explicit teaching to open ended problem solving depending on the learning styles.

Assessment procedures and reporting

The assessment programme involves formal testing including NAPLAN tests in years 3 and 5, PAT testing year 2-6 and anecdotal evidence. Individual goal setting meetings are held throughout the year with written reports in Terms 2 and 4 as well as ongoing sharing of evidence through Seesaw.

Joint programmes

Students participate in the Sports Day, with Beachport and Rendelsham Primary Schools. The Upper Primary class connect with small schools that feed to Millicent High School as part of their transition to high school.

Sporting Activities

Students are involved in a daily fitness/health programme. Students have been selected for SAPSASA in football, netball, cricket, soccer, athletics and tennis with a number of students participating in cross country and the annual Millicent football/netball gala day. The curriculum supports development of skills with experts sharing skills in basketball, cricket and football. Students participate in the local basketball round robin competition.

Other Co-Curricular Activities

General

The students perform in an end-of-year concert and share their learning at our assemblies, which are held twice a term.

Staffing is stable, with a variety of skills and experiences.

School Facilities

Buildings and Grounds

The Mount Burr Primary School is an open space construction which has undergone extensive renovations over the years. Interior glass walls have been installed, the wet areas have been upgraded to include a kitchen and a wellbeing space called "The Nest". A computer replacement program has been established with each student having access to a school device. A nature playground, adventure playgrounds and outdoor shelter areas have been erected. A great deal of consideration has been given to the appearance of the school to enable it to blend with the local environment. Our buildings are attractive and we have established well-cared for grounds. The Preschool is self contained in a separate building.

Cooling

Reverse cycle air conditioning and heating is installed in all learning areas.

Student facilities

A kitchen is available for student cooking etc.

The school provide students with individual learning devices.

Dedicated well resourced *Arts* space with a wide range of music, art and drama equipment.

School Operations

Decision making structures

A collaborative and consultative decision making structure has been developed and plays a significant role in budgeting and accessing school/community opinions about school programmes. Staff meet regularly for staff meetings and Governing Council meets twice a term.

Regular publications

Regular newsletters are distributed to parents. Seesaw provides parents with day to day access to the happenings in our school. Parent Information folders are available for all new families.

Teams is an ongoing source of information for staff. Individual teachers develop their own written form of communication with their students' families via the Seesaw App.

Assemblies are well attended by parents and friends. Galleries walks are established each term to showcase our student learning. Mount Burr Primary has an established web page www.mtburrps.sa.edu.au

School financial position

The school is financially sound.

Local Community

General characteristics

Families in the area are employed either at local timber mills in the area, Kimberley Clark in Millicent, businesses in Millicent or on outlying farms. The English language is predominant.

Parent and community involvement

There is a strong parent involvement in the school. Parents regard the school as the centre of the local community and there are a number of parents in the school on a regular basis. Parents are keen to provide quality facilities and attend school functions to support their children, assemblies are well patronised, likewise sports days and school and classroom activities.

Feeder schools

Students from the school generally attend Millicent High School.

Other local care and educational facilities

A bus provides transport to the local Millicent High School. Millicent is 12kms from Mount Burr and provides a range of facilities. The preschool operates over a 5 day fortnight.

Availability of staff housing

The nearest staff housing is available in Millicent – 12 kilometres from the Mount Burr Primary School township.
